RULES FOR COMPETITORS

- 1. No persons may compete who is not a bone fide owner and in possession of the stock or other competing article, previous to the date of the show.
- 2. Any person to whom a prize or premium has been awarded may be requested to satisfy the Committee, by a Declaration or by such proof as the Committee may require as to the correctness of the entry, etc., and in the event of refusal, shall be disqualified. Any objection to the Judge's award must be made in writing and handed to the Secretary together with a deposit of €40.00 within two hours of the award being made. The deposit will be refunded if proved to the satisfaction of the Show by the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 3. Any Exhibitor who shall interfere with any animal or other article exhibited by himself, or any other person in the presence of the Judge's, or to offer any opinion as to the merits or demerits of stock exhibited until after the adjudication of the Judges or who shall in any manner make the stock known, disqualified and precluded from any medal, prize or premium and in the case of such interference on the part of the Exhibitor, the Judge shall award the medal, prize or premium to the next Exhibitor in order of merit.
- 4. Notice of entries stating class, section and description of competing animal or article, shall be lodged with the Secretary on or before the date fixed for entries, and the Secretary shall cause a Catalogue to be printed for sale and distribution during the show. The Committee reserve the right of declining to receive any entry and to returning the fee without being liable for any compensating. They also reserve the right of refusing admission to any exhibit that they may deem unsuitable or unfit for any reason.
- 5. In the interests of safety, ALL STOCK MUST BE LED (including foals). The Committee shall have the right to order removal of any animal that they consider being dangerous.
- 6. In the event of insufficient entries, or from any other cause the Committee shall have the right to reduce the prize money in any competition or class, or to cancel any such competition or class.
- 7. Whilst every reasonable care will be exercised, the Show Committee will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage to any exhibit, exhibitor or spectator from any cause whatever occurring in the Show Field or in transit thereto and from.
- 8. All exhibits to be on the Show Grounds at 9.30am. Livestock must remain on exhibit until 3pm. General Exhibits must remain on display until 4pm.
- 9. Should any misunderstanding arise from the wording of any rule or from the adjudication of any prize or premium or the description of any competing animal or article, it shall be decided by the Executive Committee which shall be duly summoned for the purpose. The decision of the Committee shall be final in all classes.
- Entry Form on application to the Secretary and no other forms can be received. Entries will not
 be accepted unless accompanied by the requisite entry fees. Early entries especially requested.
- 11. The prize will be indicated by colour rosettes attached to the winners. Also, please note that in the event of insufficient entries the Show reserve the right to amalgamate classes.
- 12. The Society reserves the right to require proof of compliance with the rules before paying any prize.
- 13. In accordance with the I.S.A. Rules, 5% will be deducted from prize money in Horse, Cattle and Sheep Classes.
- 14. Last years overall winner in Cake Section will have 4 points deduced from the total points.
- 15. All cups and trophies must be returned to the Secretary, 3 weeks prior to the Show each year, and each recipient must sign a Form accepting responsibility for cups or trophies before same are handed over to the winners.
- 16. Number of prizes in any class will be one less than the number of entries where entries are less than four.
- 17. Horse Classes: Dam's name and/or number and name of Sire where available.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ANIMAL OWNERS INVOLVED IN SHOWING ANIMALS

The Irish Shows Association would advise all animal owners who have their animals insured, to extend cover while showing said animals at Shows. We understand that it will cost very little or nothing at all, depending on whom you have your insurance with. If you are one of the few who do not have cover, we would advise that you think about putting it in place for this purpose – it may be well worthwhile. The reason for us giving you this advice is to protect yourself in the event of your animal lashing out and injuring someone or damaging someone's property. If that were to happen and it is established that your animal was out of control, you may be held responsible, or partly responsible, for any injury or damage caused and may end up paying all or part of any settlement reached.

Horse riding is a dangerous sport and all competitors in Ridden Classes are strongly advised, for their own safety, to wear appropriate head gear which complies with up to date Safety Standards.

Department of Agriculture, Food and The Marine Specific Requirements – Horses and Other Equines

PREMISES REGISTRATION:

As from 1st May 2012, any premises (which includes shows, fairs and markets) where horses or other equines are gathered must be registered with the Department.

Owners/persons in charge of such gatherings are required to submit a completed Application Form for registration to keep records of movements on/off their premises.

Records must be retained for at least 3 years as they may be required by the Department for the purposes of disease.

RECORDS REQUIRED ARE:

- 1. The name and address of the owner/person in charge of the premises from which the equine came.
- 2. Premises Registration Number from which the equine came.
- 3. Passport Number / UEL Number of the animal(s).

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS REGARDING THE MOVEMENT OF BOVINE TO SHOWS

The Department of Agriculture implemented a number of changes on the 4/2/2019 which changed the procedures and criteria applicable when applying for a Certificate of Compliance for the movement of cattle. These also impact on the Certificate which is required when moving bovine to a Show.

The following sets out the criteria applicable:

- 1. The movement of cattle to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on the Animal Identification and Movement System (AIM).
- 2. In line with these changes a specific Certificate of Compliance for the Movement of Bovine from a single holding to a Show, must now be requested prior to the movement of animals concerned.
- 3. These Certificates can be created by (i) applying online using their agfood account or (ii) where the keeper is not online the Certificate can be generated by the local regional Veterinary Office following receipt of a NBAS31K with issue of the Certificate being subject to normal criteria applicable. This form will be available on the Departments Website and will also be included with the Show Circular when issued.

- 4. When applying for this Certificate the destination herd/or Show number is not required. The Certificate generated will include an "S" symbol.
- 5. The Certificate of Compliance for a Show will continue to be valid for a period of up to 30 days. As is currently the case these can be used for the movement of animals to a number of shows during the validity period of the Certificate.
- 6. Please also note Calves which are less than 10 days cannot be moved to a Show.
- 7. As is currently the case the Movement Notification Section of the Certificate should be completed by the Keeper and Show Secretary who must clearly indicate the Show Number. The Show movement should be recorded on the passport. Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling these requirements lies with the Show Secretary. If the animals move to a herd other than the source herd, the new destination herd must complete and sign the Certificate also.
- 8. Completed forms should be sent by the Show Secretary to the Local RVO within the 7 days of the Show. Animal Identification and Movement (AIM) Division. Department of Agriculture, Food and The Marine.

Specific Requirements - Sheep

All sheep must be identified individually with appropriate ear tags issued in accordance with the requirements of the National Sheep Identification System (NSIS).

MOVEMENT DOCUMENTATION:

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded on the document. Sheep from non-restricted flocks can only be moved to shows. In the case of flocks restricted following diagnosis of scrapie, sheep possessing the ARR/ARR genotype only may be exhibited. The movement of these ARR/ARR genotype sheep must be accompanied by the relevant movement permit (SCR10) which can be obtained from the local District Veterinary Office in the county where the flock is located.

AIM NOTIFICATION:

The movement of sheep to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM. This is done using a copy of the owners sheep dispatch document as follows:

- 1. The owner/keeper presents the signed and completed dispatch document to the Show Secretary who checks it to ensure that it is completed in full.
- The Show Secretary fills in the Mart section of the dispatch documents with the show number, the date of the move back to the source holding, stamps it with the show stamp and signs the dispatch document.
- 2. The show secretary then forwards the completed pink section of the dispatch document to the local DVO within the 7 days of the show movement.
- 3. The show secretary keeps a white copy for his/her records.
- 4. The source / destination keeper keeps the bottom yellow copy to enter it into their flock register.

FLOCK REGISTER:

All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in the keeper's flock register.

Discipline

The Irish Shows Association expects and will insist upon appropriate behaviour from all Exhibitors and others participating in any of the activities at our Member Shows and will not tolerate inappropriate behaviour. Inappropriate behaviour shall include but not be limited to the following:

- 1. Profanity, coarse or vulgar language or gestures towards Judges, or other Show Officials.
- 2. Harassment or bullying, including using words or actions that threaten, intimidate or undermine.
- **3.** Failure to follow rules and/or obey instructions.
- **4.** Abusing any animal.

DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES:

Complaints or misconduct against an Exhibitor or other participant at a Member Show shall be investigated and adjudicated upon by a Sub-Committee appointed by the Irish Shows Association. The said Sub-Committee shall consist of three members of the Board of the Irish Shows Association and shall be known as the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee shall seek to ensure the existence of consistent, effective, fair and transparent complaint procedures and shall act in accordance with natural and constitutional justice.

PROCEDURE:

A complaint of misconduct/inappropriate behaviour against an Exhibitor or other participant in a Member Show shall be made in writing and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Member Show within 72 hours.

A copy of the complaint shall be sent by the Secretary of the Member Show to the National Secretary of the ISA. A copy of the Complaint will be sent by the National Secretary to the person or persons against whom the Complaint is made. A person or persons against whom a written complaint is made shall have a period of 14 working days from the date of receipt of the claim to reply to the said Complaint; such reply shall be made in writing.

Both parties shall state whether an oral hearing of the complaint is sought. The Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to hold an oral hearing in regard to the Complaint whether or not sought. The Disciplinary Committee shall decide in each case whether to hold such an oral hearing in respect of the Complaint, or any part thereof and there shall be no appeal from such decision of the Disciplinary Committee.

The Disciplinary Committee shall, at any time, seek further information from either party. In the event of either party refusing or failing to provide such further information within the time specified by the Disciplinary Committee, the Committee shall be entitled to make a decision on the Complaint and/or to hold an oral hearing of the Complaint in the absence of a copy of such further information being received by the Disciplinary Committee from either party.

The Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to reject a complaint where, in the opinion of the Committee it finds there is no basis for it.

SANCTIONS:

In the event of a first incident of inappropriate / unacceptable behaviour being deemed to be proved against the offender, the Disciplinary Committee shall issue a written warning to the offender. In the event of any subsequent incident, the Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to impose sanctions on the offender, including a prohibition of such offender participating in any of the events / activities at any Member Show of the I.S.A., provided always that in the event of a first incident of inappropriate / unacceptable behaviour being deemed by the Disciplinary Committee to constitute gross misbehaviour, the Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to impose such sanctions on the offender as it deems appropriate, including the prohibition on such offender from participating in any of the events / activities of any Show Member of the ISA.

The decision of the Disciplinary Committee shall be final.

Foals must be sired by a Stallion that is classified in the Irish Sport Horse Stud Book as either, approved, preliminary approved, supplementary approved, recognised, preliminary recognised, not approved 1 (NA1) or a Stallion that is classified in the Irish Draught Stud Book as either Class 1/Class 2/RID(GB)/RID(Can)/Grade 2(GB).
- 3. The class is also open to progeny of Weatherby's registered stallions that are not classified as not approved 2 (NA2) or Entry in the Irish Horse Register.
- **4.** One foal from selected shows may qualify, provided the Judges and the I.S.A. agree the standard is high enough.
- **5.** Foals must be led at all times.
- **6.** Exhibitors to both the qualifier and the final must have the mare's passport ready for inspection prior to entry to the judging ring. "If the foals passport is not to hand". Failure to comply with this rule will lead to immediate disqualification.

- **8.** Foals qualified for the Final are not eligible to enter any other class at the Show in which the Final is held other than qualifying classes for other Finals.

- **3.** Foals must be led at all times.
- **4.** One Mare and Foal may qualify at each show.
- 5. Exhibitors to both the qualifier and Final must have their Mares Passport available for inspection prior to entry to Judging Ring. Failure to comply with this rule will lead to immediate disqualification.
- **6.** Passports and Microchips should be read by the Vet at the Final.
- 7. One of the Judges at the qualifying show must be a qualified Irish Draught Horse Judge.
- **8.** Animals qualified for the Final are not eligible to enter any other class at Mohill Show other than qualifying classes for other ISA Finals.
- **9.** These rules should be read in conjunction with the General ISA Rules.

- 2. Fillies must have both sire and dam recorded on their passport.
- **3.** Exhibitors to both the Qualifier and Final must have their animals passport available for inspection prior to entry to Judging Ring. Failure to comply with this rule will lead to immediate disqualification.
- **4.** One animal in each qualifying class may be selected to compete in the Final provided the Judges and the I.S.A, agree the standard is high enough.
- 5. One of the Judges at the Qualifying Show must be a qualified Irish Draught Horse Judge.
- **6.** Passports and microchips should be read by a Vet at the Final.
- 7. Animals qualified for Final are not eligible to enter any other class at Show where Final is held other than qualifying classes for other Finals.
- **8.** These rules are read in conjunction with the General I.S.A. Rules.
